Organisation

Our goal was to attract an audience of our targeted public (teachers, educators, youth workers) and beyond. First, we disseminated the event via a large amount of email invitations with the infopack and the agenda to the schools and teachers of the Strasbourg region. We disseminated posts about the event on all our social media platforms (Instagram, Facebook and LinkedIn). ALDA also used its french national network to connect with associations whose members are youth workers potentially interested in the project and its thematic. Flyers were also distributed at key points in the city of Strasbourg like at schools, social cultural centres and other associations. Our partners of the conference also disseminated the events to their own network. Our agenda was thought out to be the most pertinent when it comes to the themes treated and their order. The participants registered via google forms and for those who did not speak french a live translation was proposed in english. For the second event, as we already had established relations with the association Notre Dame, we simply reached out to their members.

Realisation

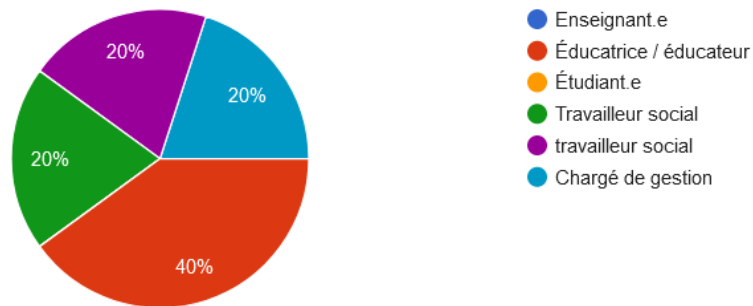
We had a first part which focused on general prevention to radicalisation with the P/CVE Coordinator of the Municipality of Strasbourg. Alongside, on the positive prevention of violent radicalisation through projects by and for young people, the parisian NGO *Youth ID* presented its very innovative approach and its range of activities. Then, a very thorough and detailed presentation of the RADEX project took place which focused on the skills to promote to prevent radicalisation and violent extremism. To be noted that the academic background of the project leader for ALDA on radicalisation helped to bring precise insights on the matter. The public was particularly engaged and vividly participated in the question and answer session which turned into a fruitful exchange and discussion on existing and future possibilities of initiatives. The evening ended with a buffet and a cocktail reception.

What is your profession ?



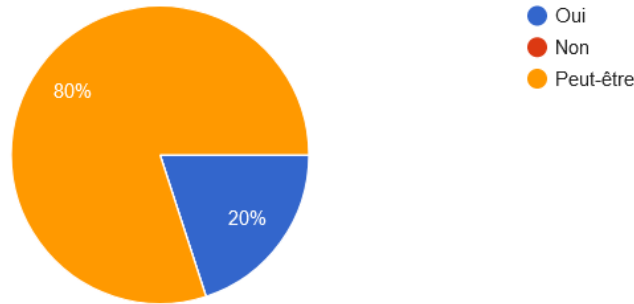
Most participants who took the evaluation were educators or social workers
