The RADEX project is coming to an end but the results of the project are meant to last

The RADEX project aims to prevent and divert violent radicalisation and extremism of young people, provide youth workers with tools, knowledge, to detect the radicalization processes and educational resources on violent radicalisation and extremism. By **enhancing critical thinking and proactiveness** in online social communication and behaviour of young people, we intend to help to prevent radicalisation processes. Our work is also centered on raising awareness among local, national and EU actors on youth radicalisation processes.

You can find **online and for free** our e-course which aims to train professionals working with young people who are at risk of violent radicalisation with an emphasis on online grooming. It introduces the concept of violent radicalisation and teaches how to effectively prevent violent radicalisation by adopting positive approaches. The last few weeks, we organized multiplier events in our respective countries to meet and engage with our public. During those conferences, we presented the project, the platform, its objectives and the ensemble of the ins and outs of the process. It was also the opportunity to invite **local and national stakeholders** on the question of radicalisation. For example, the Municipality of Strasbourg was represented by one of the speakers (who was the only mission head on radicalisation for a municipality in France). The public was particularly engaged and fruitful exchanges took place. Evaluations of the events showed that the public was very satisfied by the presentations and the approach, and confirmed the **usefulness of such projects and outputs in their professional life**.
